

#### Have You Considered an End-of-the-Year Gift to Children and SHC?

- A gift credit to the donor and an immediate income tax deduction for securities at market value on the date of transfer
- The donor pays no capital gains taxes on securities donated to the SHC
- A gift can be designated for a particular purpose or endeavor taking place at our hospitals

The true upside to this type of giving arrangement is that the donor realizes the immediate satisfaction of his/her gift helping the children cared for by SHC. These gifts can help fund medical treatments, research, and the daily operation of our 23-hospital network.
